

place to meet Friends, Gain Knowledge, and


share "Real" Mutual Experience with everyone. I encourage all of you to attend our 2024 Education events to gain these experiences.


I want to send a huge shout-out to Kathy Bray, IAMIC Chair. She has been an amazing


IAMIC Anti-Trust Statement



much work to be done, but by joining together as an association, great things can be accomplished. Times like these are why being a part of an association is so important. We work with you to protect you and your mutual.










